SWORN COMPLAINT BEFORE THE TEXAS ETHICS COMMISSION

An individual must be a resident of the state of Texas to be eligible to file a sworn complaint with the Texas Ethics Commission. The complainant is required to attach to the complaint a copy of one of the following documents:

· complainant's driver's license or personal identification certificate issued under Chapter 521 of the Transportation Code, or commercial driver's license issued under Chapter 522 of the Transportation Code; or

· a utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows the name and address of the complainant and is dated not more than 30 days before the date on which the complaint is filed.

Effective September 1, 2009, an individual may also be eligible to file a sworn complaint with the Texas Ethics Commission if the individual owns real property in the state of Texas. Under this provision, the complainant will be required to attach to the complaint a copy of a property tax bill, notice of appraised value, or other government document that shows the name of the complainant, shows the address of the real property in Texas, and identifies the complainant as the owner of the

Senator Davis is a candidate for Texas Governor and she is the treasurer of the specific-purpose committee Wendy R Davis for Governor, Inc. ("SPAC"). She has raised contributions for that office through her candidate/officeholder account ("COH") and the SPAC.

Senator Davis Personally Profits From Her Book:

According to press reports, in 2013, Senator Davis, through her wholly owned company, Croquet and Other Games LLC ("LLC"), entered into a contract with Blue Rider Press, a subsidiary of Penguin Random House, to write and publish a memoir. According to her tax returns, Senator Davis, through her LLC, received in excess of \$130,000 from Blue Rider Press as an advance on future royalties from sales of her book.

Political Funds Paid For Senator Davis To Travel To New York City:

On September 9-10, 2014, Senator Davis traveled to New York City. According to quotes attributed to her communications director, Zac Petkanas, Senator Davis's campaign paid for the travel. Based on prior filings with the Texas Ethics Commission, I believe this travel was paid for by the SPAC, but it is possible it was paid for by the COH. While in New York City, Senator Davis did two things: she promoted her book (which she personally profits from) and she held a single solitary campaign fundraiser.

Senator Davis's Interviews In New York City Were For Her Personal Benefit, Not The Campaign's:

The interviews took place on September 9-10. These interviews—the purpose and intent of which were to promote her book (again, Senator Davis receives royalties from the book sales)—were obviously of a personal benefit to Senator Davis. The purpose and intent of the interviews is evident from the content of those interviews; the news reports of the interviews; and, indeed, her own campaign communications director. Mr. Petkanas said in an article that the campaign purpose was "to attend a campaign event", while the "other non-campaign activities" were "scheduled by and covered by...persons not affiliated with the campaign." In other words, Mr. Petkanas admitted that the interviews were not campaign activities, were not designed to support the campaign, and were not coordinated or staffed by the campaign. According to news reports, Penguin Random House arranged the interviews for Senator Davis.

The Campaign Event Was A Small, Minor Activity On The Trip:

The campaign event took place on September 10. There were no campaign events on September 9. Therefore, there was no campaign purpose for traveling to New York City on September 9, and no campaign purpose to pay for lodging on September 9. The only reason for such a trip would be to allow Senator Davis to take a free ride on the campaign's tab to promote her book, which she personally profits from.

Texas Law Prohibits Personal Use Of Political Contributions:

Texas law prohibits converting political funds to a candidate's personal use. This prohibition applies whether the funds were accepted and spent by the COH or by the SPAC. Thus, regardless of which campaign entity paid for the travel, the prohibition would apply.

The Trip Was Primarily Personal Use:

Texas law defines personal use as one that primarily furthers individual purposes not connected with the performance of the duties or activities of a candidate for or holder of public office. Looking at the facts, it is clear that the vast majority of the time on the trip was spent on promoting Senator Davis's book. Indeed, a simple balancing act of time shows that the more than 7 interviews—spanning both September 9 and 10—far outweigh the single event campaign purpose, which only occurred on September 10. Further, there was no campaign purpose for travel to New York City on September 9, as the only activity conducted in the City on that day was interviews to promote the book.

Senator Davis Violated The Law:

If Senator Davis paid for this trip from her COH, she violated the law by converting contributions she accepted to her personal use. If the SPAC paid for the trip, Senator Davis again violated the law, as she is the treasurer of her SPAC.

Since launching a tour Monday to promote the book, titled "Forgetting to Be Afraid," Davis has traveled to New York to appear for in-studio interviews on two MSNBC shows, a CNN program and HuffPost Live, the website's live-streaming network. She has also filmed satellite interviews from New York for TV stations elsewhere in the country, one of which aired Wednesday morning on a Fox affiliate in North Carolina. The national promotion has raised some eyebrows back home, where her publisher, Penguin Random House, also set up at least one satellite interview, with the Fox affiliate in Dallas.

Spokesman Zac Petkanas said the campaign used its funds to fly Davis to New York, where she was scheduled to go to a fundraiser in addition to promoting her book. "The purpose of this trip is to attend a campaign event and, therefore, the plane ride is covered by the campaign," Petkanas said in a statement. "Any other non-campaign activities were scheduled by and covered by the appropriate parties not affiliated with the campaign." Penguin Random House arranged the promotional activities, apparently informing the North Carolina TV outlet and others that she would be available for satellite interviews between 8 and 10 a.m. Eastern time Wednesday.
